1. What was your greatest accomplishment?

I co-authored legislation aimed at denouncing and addressing the burden placed on international students forced to take unnecessary classes solely to accumulate credits to meet the F1 - VISA requirements.

2. What barriers and/or difficulties did you face this quarter? How do you plan to address these if they arise in the future?

This quarter, despite the usual adaptation process of learning the structure and operation of the senate, I didn't face any significant challenges, except for the difficulty of reaching out to a larger number of international students, whom I represent, I had wished

To overcome this obstacle, especially in the absence of structured settings for such interactions, I plan to dedicate my personal free time to engage in conversations with a wider range of international students beyond my immediate circle.

3. What are your goals for the Spring Quarter? How will you measure success in these?

I am prioritizing increased participation during senate sessions, actively engaging with each resolution presented through questioning or active participation in debates. My aim is to fully leverage the title and responsibilities of being a senator, rather than solely benefiting from its recognition.

My point of measurement will be feedback from my colleagues or the speakers and selfevaluation.
