#### I. Guest introductions:

- a. Mark Waldstein—assisted in founding Second Story Theater and performs as an actor locally. Suggested participatory acting classes that would be simple with scripts, reading, character development—a "reader's theater". Perhaps some limited movement would be included. Attention would be placed on gender neutral scripts so roles would be more evenly divided by gender.
  Secondly, he is interested in teaching a jazz related history class.
- b. Mary Anne Moorman—storyteller on KCBS radio. Stories tell what happened and can encompass themes of history, nostalgia, family, person, business, and include traditional tale such as Jack tales, Celtic tales and children's tales. She would also

teach storytelling methodology, and the type of media required for story.

- ~Three classes are being offered at the Boys and Girls Club. The City of Bellevue and TELOS/TSO are promoting these classes using flyers and social media. It is hoped that those attending these classes will find them interesting enough to investigate and attend classes at the North Campus.
- ~ Two new instructors will be teaching during the Winter Quarter: Cindy Xie is an instructor on the main campus and has a PhD in biomedical research. She will teach "Anatomy". John Jensen, who led the C&W session on radio personalities, will be teaching a course on "The Home Front during WWII". Three new instructors, who are proposing courses for Spring Quarter, are being interviewed this week.
- ~ Fall enrollments were lower than the prior year, but popular classes filled and there were waitlists. In an effort to get waitlisted students into popular class topics there will be a third "View of the News" taught by Carla Barnes. Also scheduled are a second "Balance" class taught by Irene Pasternak and a "Drawing Continued" class taught by Stacey Almgren in addition to her class "Intro to Drawing". If there is enough demand, a third "Tai Chi" class could be arranged.
