## II. Guests

- a. **Andrew Baze** teaches concepts applicable to all operating systems that “grandma” can use. He uses worksheets and handouts to communicate with humans which he feels is the most difficult human task. He will teach a seminar and a 4-week class.
- b. **Claudia Lawrey** proposes an “Out and About” course on the Arts. There is a syllabus for the course with objectives and outcomes. The course is meant to explore a core sample of arts organizations who are amenable to the course objectives. A quarter would consist of the first class becoming familiar with the objectives and the last class would sum up with the outcomes. There would be visits to six different arts involved organizations with 8 to 10 enrolled students.
