I. Guests

- a. Jennifer Sohonie, Director of Community Solutions, expressed concerns on several issues:

 College, and probably should be called **Events.**
 - 2. Because of parking issues, all committee and organizations should meet after 3:30 pm. The Chair listed all committees and organizations as meeting after 3:30 pm during January and February. There are no classes on Friday's which allows committees and organizations to meet on Friday's.
 - 3. Staff at the reception desk, and program managers only operate the TELOS program, and do not have knowledge of the TSO events.
 - More emphasis by Class Hosts regarding information on business cards should be encouraged.
 - 4. Promotion: there is student and instructor confusion between TELOS and TSO which needs to changed to enhance the experience and encourage people and instructors to participate. The Chair: A name change to TELOS Learning Community (TLC) was proposed and approved by the TSO Council and Student body. Michael Kaptic, Dean of Student Life, has some concerns. TSO Council President, Edie Heppler, stated the student body has the right to name itself. Additional conversations on this subject are being pursued.
 - 5. Custodial work only occurs at night. The event manager (host) is responsible for making the event location clean, placing chairs and tables in order, and garbage removed following an event.
