- c. Darina and Alessandro Regio were contacted by Chris in the event they might be interested in presenting seminars. Their proposal are presentations on two major topics: "The Death of Non-Proliferation"-- a series of four lectures by Alessandro Regio; and "21st Century Envionmentalism: What? Why? And What's Next?"--a series of six presentations by Darina Regio. Council discussion centered on when these seminars could take place because of the 5-weeks required to process speaking engagements. The Council will cooperate with the Administration in arriving at a solution. The second issue is the proper amount of compensation that should paid.
