# **Reports from Staff**

Bellevue College Interim President: Gary Locke

- 1. Finances
  - a. The Foundation is administered by the Work Force area
  - b. The Student Activity fee is a student affairs benefit program with a process that can be released and used
    - 1. Currently there is a one and one-half monthly wait prior to obtaining permissions for even minor expenses. This needs to be adjusted
- 2. Continuing Education
  - a.. This department needs to streamline and revise curriculum
    - 1. Courses require personal interaction—hand-on experience
    - 2. Adjustments in teaching are required with safety and health issues
    - 3. Cannot be 100% online
- 3. Enrollments have increased in comparison to other schools and are above last year's enrollment
  - a. There is diversity in course offerings that attract diverse students
    - 1. "*Running start*" provides courses for high school students so high school students can also take courses at Bellevue College and graduate simultaneously with high school. They are eligible to enroll in a four year college as a junior
    - 2. Programs for students with disabilities are available for those who might not otherwise be served
  - b. Input into course design is ongoing so that relationships are stimulating and interesting
- 4. Financial aid is available. There are core uses with a streamlined fast process
- 5. Answers to questions
  - a. What about survivability in the Bellevue College system?
    ~TELOS is self supporting with a sufficient enrollment to pay for instructors. It will stay.
  - b. What about the student activities fee?
    - ~There is support for the student activity fee. Make sure there is a clear policy and procedures for these funds and streamline access. Council should establish guidelines with framework for the funds using permanent language in a resolution to the Board of Trustees.
    - c. How can TSO assist with lobbying the legislature?

~Education is important to receive the continual training and retraining during our lives. Technical training needs more recognition. Currently Bellevue College's only hands-on training is in the healthcare field. Attending candidate forums is one method of contacting legislators, but messaging a personal story is very effective also

- 6. Policy issues that need addressing
  - a. Holding classes and meeting with "*Zoom*" is a reasonable policy even though the school is officially part of Microsoft "Teams". Gov. Locke is still inquiring about this problem.
  - b. TSO funding needs resolution because the student approval process is too long especially for a small amount of money
  - c. There are only 17 Winter Quarter classes which does not meet the needs of the population. How can we work together to create a more robust offering of classes? Perhaps a volunteer could be hired to assist with TELOS, or the foundation funds could be used to fund a position that would work with Jennifer. A large variety of courses attract students, and there needs to be a lot more collaboration and sharing to continue to have sufficient sign-up for classes. Gov. Locke was not familiar with this problem

Continuing Education Executive Director: Jennifer Sohonie

The challenges are difficult with the loss of two positions. It is too early to tell if there are enough resources to adequately formulate a comprehensive curriculum

Director of Student Programs: Carrie Moore

- 1. Chris Stoynov has given very good guidance and support to TSO
- 2. TSO leadership has done a good job in reporting, but it would be helpful to continue.
- 3. Darina and Alessandro Regio's classes have gone very well. Their paperwork on Winter quarter classes were not received. Also not received were proposals from Jim Maynard
- 4. Because of personnel changes, there was confusion concerning the date when course proposals for Winter Quarter were due
- 5. A Program Manager, Annie deLeon, is currently being trained in Community Education. She will assist Brian Kim
