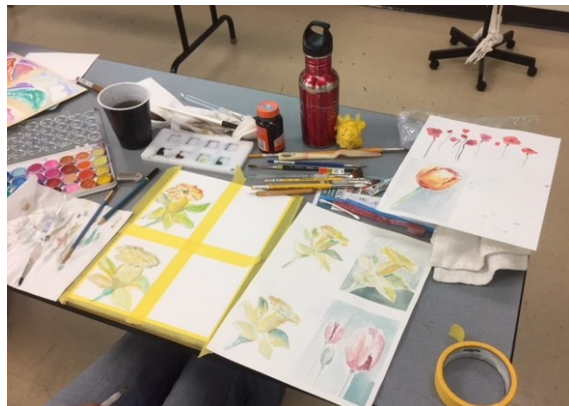

Does this sound like you?

A recent survey of 350 TELOS students found that most respondents:

- Rate TELOS courses either Very Good (41%) or Excellent (49%)
- Take courses primarily at TELOS (81%), and have been doing so for three years or more (58%)
- Choose courses based on long-term personal interest (71%)
- Value the variety of subjects (82%) and quality of TELOS instructors (72%)

The survey invitation was sent to students on the TSO (TELOS Student Organization) opt-in email list and to all students in BC Continuing Education (BC CE) classes. Interestingly, while 51% of students who responded to the TSO invitation rate TELOS courses "Excellent" only 33% of the general BC CE respondents did so. While sampling differences limit interpretation, it could be that:

- Students who opt-in to the TSO email list may be more engaged in learning generally and more likely to find value and meaning in their courses.
- TSO events often feature TELOS instructors, helping assess instructors' teaching.
- Word of mouth among students involved in TSO's extra-curricular activities may help students choose courses that are a better fit for them.
- The TSO list has higher percentage of longer-term students, so the result may be due to sample bias, that is, if they are not happy in the first year, they don't return.
